The content of this study day is aimed specifically at neonatologists and paediatricians who are involved in the neurodevelopmental assessment of high-risk infants in follow up clinics. If you would like to enhance your ability to provide developmental support and anticipatory guidance to parents to promote optimal child development, then this training is for you.

You will gain insight into how to support and guide parents with their infant's developmental process as part of your multi-disciplinary follow up team or until additional and specialised services are available.

You will learn how to provide targeted early intervention focussing on everyday activities which are understandable for parents and their infants, based on commonly seen developmental challenges in the first 2 years.

Common neurological and developmental concerns and Anticipatory Guidance and Early Intervention at the following ages:

- 0-3 months
- 3-6 months
- 6-12 months
- 12-24 months
- Overview of the Ei SMART framework and evidence underpinning / supporting the approach.
- How co-production is embedded within the Ei SMART approach.

Ei SMART is a framework for clinical reasoning based on evidence-based principles to give high risk babies the best start in life. It spans infant development from birth to pre-school and beyond. It uniquely supports infant development by integrating Sensory, Motor, Attention and regulation and Relational development through co-production between multi-disciplinary healthcare professionals and parents working Together.

This study day is co-developed and presented by our team of therapists, (OT, PT, SLT), nursing and medical practitioners, and parents with lived experience of having babies and young children with developmental differences and challenges.
